Midway Meadows Assistance Program Update

The Midway Meadows Assistance Program (MMAP) has officially launched and we are awaiting your ideas and submissions.

MMAP allows a member to offset MMVHOA costs for capital improvements that benefit the neighborhood. This year's budget is \$2,500, with a per request maximum allowable amount of \$250.

Members submit an application (before or after work is performed) which is evaluated by the officers and the status is communicated back to the member. If approved, once the work is completed, the member is reimbursed the approved amount.

Party. The remaining directories will be distributed by the street representatives to members on their respective streets.




Electronic Payments

Gated Community?

From time to time, Midway Meadows residents ask about converting the neighborhood into a gated community. Ever wondered what is involved in making such a change?





- Convert Midway Meadows Volunteer HOA to a mandatory HOA, with all homes required to join
- Combine Midway Meadows and of Midway neighborhoods and

nd Villas nd HOAs

• All homes in Midway Meadows and Villas of Midway must agree to convert to a gated community



- Pay approximately \$15,000 in fees to the city as part of an application, evaluation, and approval process
- · Construct any necessary walls, barriers, and fences paid for by the HOA
- HOA to maintain streets, sidewalks, and alleys to city standards. In the event the HOA becomes defunct, individual homeowners and heirs become responsible for maintenance.



- Arrange for access to emergency services
- · Reroute utilities if necessary
- Commit to 40 years as a gated community

There are more requirements to the conversion; however, the above list shows that such a change would be a major undertaking and would dramatically change the dynamics of the neighborhood.

Poop Scoop Box

You may have noticed and used the yellow Poop Scoop box on the greenbelt, which was hand constructed by Steve McCluer. Based on discussions between Steve and the city, the VHOA would provide the box and the city would provide and maintain a garbage can. The city recently stated that the VHOA would have to pay for purchase and installation of a city approved stand, as well as continually purchasing city approved bags. The approved stand would be at the White River entrance of Timberglen Park. Based on the new city requirements, it was decided
